ower Yellowstone Rural Electric Cooperative will award 20, \$1,000 scholarships at the co-op's annual meeting Wednesday, June 1.

To be eligible:

- The parent/guardian of the applicant must be a member who is currently receiving electric service from Lower Yellowstone Electric.
- The applicant must be a student who is enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited two- or four-year college/university or vocational school for the upcoming fall term.
- The applicant must be accompanied by a parent/ guardian and both must be present to win.
- An individual applicant can receive a maximum of two luck-of-the-draw scholarships.
